Dearest Club Supporter,

Annual reports serve as a testament to the impact made in the preceding year, a canvas on which we paint our past accomplishments and future ambitions. Yet, sharing the depth and breadth of our mission feels like attempting to capture a boundless horizon in the confines of a photograph. The life-affirming vibrancy of the boys and girls we serve, the preciousness of each individual member, and the promise of their collective potential - these things defy easy explanation.

There were many watershed moments that we celebrated together in 2023. Among them, the launch of programs spearheaded by our two new full-time Resiliency Coordinators stands out prominently. The unwavering support from The Logan Fund enabled us to provide our members with access to a dedicated team of professional counselors whose deep passion for the mental health of our youth can be summed up in the empowering mantra that "Together, we can do hard things."

Our commitment to nurturing the aspirations of our teens also flourished with the expansion of Project Hope. Originating from the visionary minds of David and Terri Luck, Project Hope now extends last-mile college funding and wraparound support to any Club member with the resolve to work hard and dream big.

Furthermore, our dedication to academic success reached new heights, marked by the inception of innovative STEM programs and high-impact tutoring initiatives. The introduction of the Claire Waddell Reading Program symbolizes our commitment to kindling a love for literacy within our community. Notably, 87% of our members achieved a grade of C or better on their report cards this year, and, for the 16th consecutive year, 100% of our high school seniors graduated on time.

While these accomplishments are undoubtedly cause for celebration, the true essence of the Club experience lies in a realm more nuanced and subtle. It is found in the thousands of everyday touchpoints that accumulate into meaningful relationships. It is the act of zipping up a child's coat, helping a young person through a tough math problem, or being in the stands to cheer them on when they score a point for the team. It is the experience of guiding them through conflicts with compassion or simply being a steadfast listening ear, dependable day after day.

The grand achievements are wonderful, but the heart of our impact is in these quiet, steady moments, which slowly, over the course of countless meaningful connections, shape lives. As we reflect on the past year, it is these small blessings that add up to something more profound than can ever be communicated with charts and statistics.

At the end of the day, our work is about relationships. Sometimes, what young people need the most is just to know how much the community cares about them and their futures.

If you are reading this letter, then thank you. It is your relationship with us that has allowed us to be there for the hundreds of thousands of children who have walked through our doors over the last thirty years - and it is what will allow us to keep being there in 2024 and beyond.

We believe that every child is capable of greatness and has liberty to make choices that can lead to a better life. Our role is not to prescribe a path for young people, but to inspire and enable them to uncover their own unique strengths, gifts, and abilities.



ONCE A CLUB KiD...



When I was six, my mother gave my siblings and me our first Boys & Girls Club cards. It was either in the fall of '94 or the spring of '95. These cards gave us access to a childhood of joy, friends, role models, life lessons, and love. I was able to experience things that I wouldn't have without the Club, like weekly summer trips to pools and rivers, field trips to professional and semi-pro baseball, football and basketball games, zoos, aquariums, and more. I was taught and supported by amazing men like Josh Queen, Bob Bell, and Kevin Lauritsen. During the years when I didn't have much interaction with my father, the man I loved most in this world, these men played a significant role in filling that gap. The Club also helped me create lifelong friendships with other members. If not for the Boys & Girls Club, I may not have met Angel, my wife and the mother of our six children. Although we got together years later, I am grateful to God for the Boys & Girls Club that made it possible to meet her. Today, my Club experience comes full circle; our kids come here as members and are thriving. Our 8th-grade son has recently won Youth of the Month. Our twin 5th-grade daughters are in K-Kids and are being mentored by Ms. Bonnie, a staff member that mentored my wife and me when we were members. Then there's my adorable kindergarten daughter. Her lovely little presence is stealing the hearts of all the staff that work with her.

I believe there is one reason I started working here as a teen—working here from the age of 17 to 23—why I came back in 2016 at 28, and why I'm still here. **Our kids need love.** More than getting A's and B's and learning the expectations of our society. More than winning in sports, they need love. The wisest and most loving man once said, "As I have loved you, so you must love one another." My primary mission here at our Club is to love and show our youth how to love others, even those who may not like you. I have learned that love is an action—a verb. Love is more than just a word. For me, it's talking to the quiet student in the corner or using what little Spanish I know to communicate with an only Spanish-speaking student. It's letting our Club members know that "I see you." Sometimes it's just a side hug, fist bump, high five, secret handshake, or whatever they need that day. It's letting my vacation hours stack up because I want to be here to let the kids know they are seen. I know they come for us, the staff; just like when I was little, I came and saw one of my favorite staff members, Josh Queen, in hopes of beating him in ping pong and getting a good laugh. We never know what "love" looks like to them outside these walls. We truly don't know if this is the only place they may see and receive love. But, whether it is or isn't, they will receive love from me. I once thought to myself, "I can't deal with all these kids every day and then go home to 3, then 4, then 5, and now six kids of my own." But God is good and has filled me with abundant love and joy to share. It never runs out. His love overflows so that my love can overflow to all our hundreds of kids. As Will Ferrell says in the movie, Semi-Pro "Everybody love everybody."

TEENS AT THE CLUB

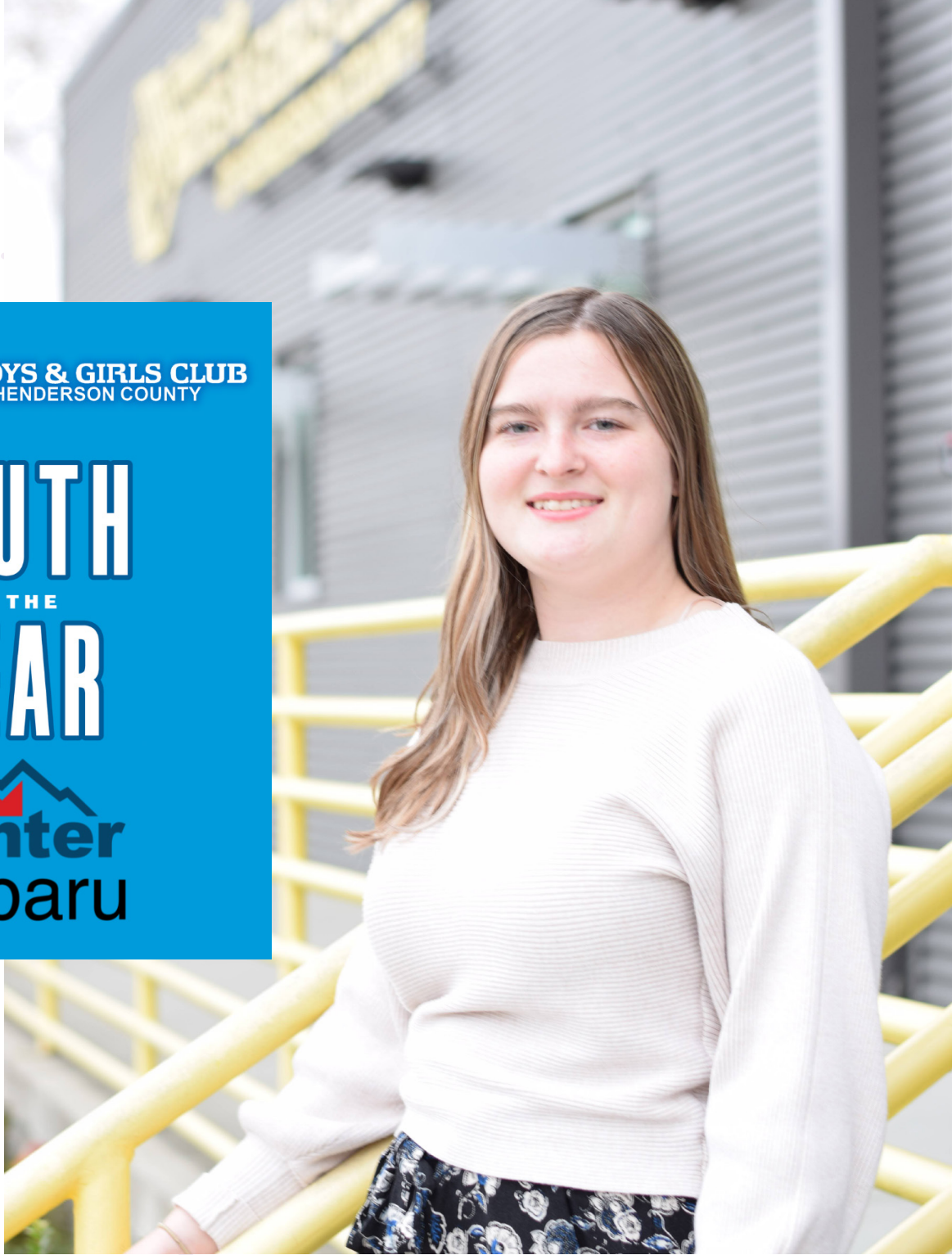
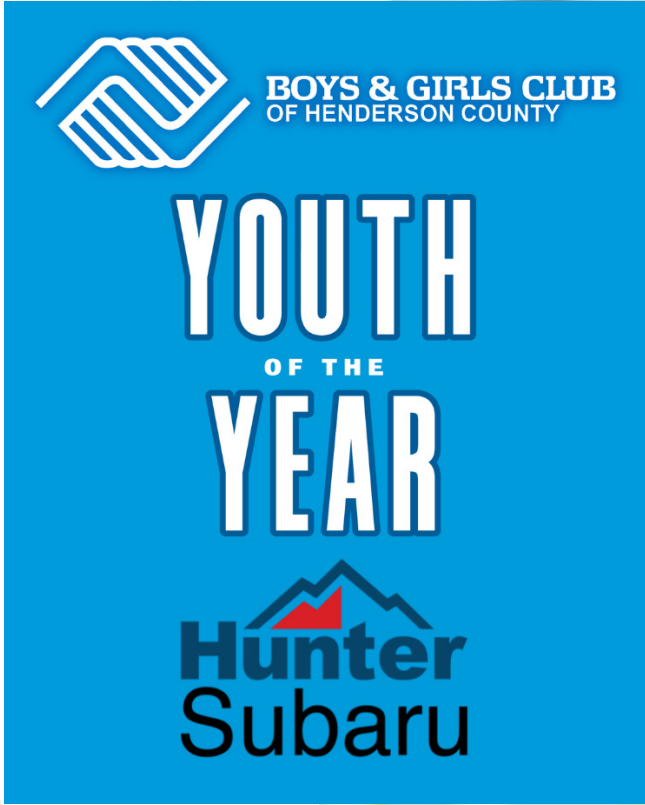
